President's Letter



Howdy!

I hope this letter finds everyone in good health and good spirits. With Memorial Day just last weekend, I would like to take time to reflect and remember those who have served our country very honorably and are no longer with us. Their sacrifices are greatly appreciated as they afford us the freedoms we have today.

Two years ago, Crystal and I were in Southern Indiana for my father's 70th birthday. While we were there, we spent some time geocaching in old cemeteries. We like to check out the history and the variety of markers. We learned a lot about the local area, including the founding members of the cemetery, family plots, and veteran status. During this trip, we were checking out the markers with American flags next to them. We also noticed the ones that had verbiage or symbols that indicated service but had no flags. We went back to town and bought flags to put on the graves that had none. Those graves were typically Civil War era graves that possibly no longer had family in the area to take care of.

While we were out placing flags, we came across an elderly gentleman visiting family as his wife sat in the car since she could not handle walking in the rough terrain of the grounds. We noticed that one of his family graves was that of a service member and that it didn't have a flag. We offered him a flag to place. We got chatting with him, and it turns out that he knew my older relatives. He gave us a complete rundown of the cemetery and some insight into the local legend of "Bloody Mary's Grave" (http://jcincemeteries.wikia.com/wiki/Baldwin Cemetery). We had a great experience and helped make that man's day. As we parted, he commented that it was nice to see young people paying their respects to people they did not even know. All three of us will remember that encounter for a very long time.

Now what does this have to do with the Diving Rebels? Much! This is a true story about community, taking an interest in others, caring, taking action, exploration, family, and following one's passions. We have had the ongoing theme of building community within the club. Having a well-developed, engaged diving community adds value to membership. I venture to say that those who seek out a dive club have a passion about diving and exploration and that they are looking for others with the same interests to share in the explorations. For the past 20+ years, the Diving Rebels have had an annual January outing to San Marcos to help the environment by actively cleaning up the San Marcos River. We also make yearly donations to organizations dear to the members such as the Turtle Rescue, Lionfish Containment Unit, and Soldiers Undertaking Disabled Scuba. To help grow the opportunity for taking an interest in others, we have introduced the Member Spotlight feature in the newsletter, and we now ask random members to chat about their diving experiences at the start of our membership meetings. I learned much about **Ron Hyatt** at the May meeting. During the Lake Tyler outing, we learned much about **Robert Cox** while hanging out at the campfire and sharing a couple of meals. All of these things combined make lifelong friends and encounters that will be remembered for a very long time. There is a key to all of this, and that is being engaged in the Diving Rebels Scuba Club by attending and being active at outings and volunteering at all levels of the organization, which really elevates the value of one's membership.

Some people who come to mind when thinking about the aspects laid out above are **Jim Kirchhoff**, his wife **Phyllis**, and his son **Phil**. All three have been long-time Diving Rebels and active participants in the club, and Phil is currently the president of Inland Divers, which has a very nice facility at Possum Kingdom Lake that a number of Diving Rebels have utilized and enjoyed. Sadly, Jim passed away last month. A group of us went to the service to pay our respects, to honor a good man, and to be supportive to his family. The club sent a bouquet of red and white roses that sat prominently to the right of the memorial, and there was a medium-sized table that had an array of memorabilia showing Jim's interests and passions, including several Rebel Wear items. After the service, we received a nice note from Phil that I would like to share:

"Thank you all so much for the flowers you sent for my Dad's Funeral. He always loved the Rebels and would have been very pleased with you guys honoring him. Thanks again!!!!" — Phil Kirchoff

While writing this, I started to wonder how the Diving Rebels could expand their giving back to the community. I'm kicking around the idea of the club's adopting an older cemetery or two so that at least once per year our volunteers could help tend to the markers of those grave sites that don't have anyone left to care for them. 

Join the Diving Rebels at Oklahoma's **Tenkiller State Park** on **July 21–23** for a weekend of camping, diving, and fellowship! The club has reserved and paid for three campsites for Friday and Saturday night in the **Fox Squirrel Campground** (sites 53, 54, and 55). All three sites have water and electrical hookups, and we can put two camping setups on each site. We will have to put any additional campers on a tent site if they are available. There will be an outing meal share on for a Saturday night and Sunday morning meal—all other meals are on your own. I do need volunteers to help with both meals, so if you can help out, please let me know. Remember that the club reimburses volunteers for the food (minus their portion of the meal share) and that you can earn extra DRIFT points for volunteering to help at the outing. **For more information about the outing or to volunteer to help, please contact me at president@divingrebels.org or phone (817) 723-6983.**

Known as Oklahoma's "heaven in the hills," Tenkiller State Park offers a peaceful getaway in beautiful Green Country. Guests will enjoy an abundance of recreational opportunities on Lake Tenkiller as well as in the park, including swim beaches, a swimming pool, a children's fishing pond, hiking trails, and more. Rent a one-, two-, or three-bedroom cabin, or claim a spot in one of Tenkiller's 10 campgrounds. The park, of course, features Lake Tenkiller. The lake has a new scuba dive park (http://www.laketenkiller.com/scuba/) that features underwater attractions, secure campsites, and clean facilities. Divers from Oklahoma, Texas, Kansas, and all surrounding states have long labeled the crystal clear waters of Tenkiller as their destination of choice. The mildly sloping hills and rock cliffs are not confined to the land; they provide an intriguing underwater terrain down to 165 feet, making Tenkiller one of the deepest lakes in the area.





The lake offers the perfect environment for every diver from novice to the most adept instructors. There are a few dive shops to choose from to obtain a certification, rent or purchase equipment, or find out where to explore. Tenkiller offers an assortment of wonderful diving possibilities. There are several islands that are superior dive sites for discovering overhangs so dramatic that they could pass for caves or for partaking in spear fishing for any fish that is not a game fish. There have been catfish speared as large as 65 pounds!! Remember, though, to obtain an Oklahoma fishing license before heading down if you want to try your luck spear fishing!
